Grace Baldwin was born in San Francisco, traveled to Southern California to attend college, has remained in Southern California and now lives in Grand Terrace.

In the fourth grade, Grace became interested in music and began studying the flute, continued with lessons, and played in the orchestra at Pomona College where she graduated with a degree in Mathematics, raised four children.
